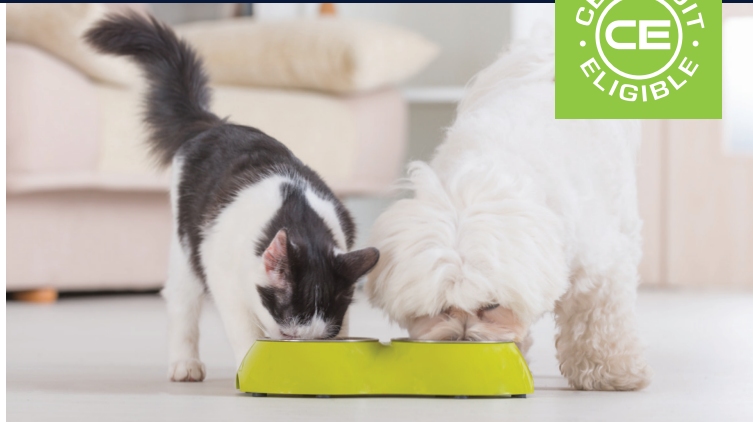

Dr. Jackie Parr (aka The Kibble Queen™), a Board-Certified Veterinary Nutritionist® and one of under 100 Diplomates of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (Nutrition), is a proud Canadian who currently resides in Athens, Georgia, USA with her beloved Boston Terrier. Festooned with veterinary and academic designations that speak to a passion for science and veterinary medicine that borders on obsession, Dr. Parr is among the elite where pet nutrition is concerned. A natural educator, Dr. Parr is widely sought after in professional circles as both a public speaker, and as a specialist for consults on the most unique and emergent nutritional cases. She is a passionate nutrition advocate and an accessible expert with feet planted firmly in both the academic and practical worlds of specialized nutritional medicine. She is a proud Founding Member and the Inaugural President of the Canadian Academy of Veterinary Nutrition (CAVN) and was delighted to join the University of Georgia's College of Veterinary Medicine in 2020 as the Nestlé Purina Petcare Clinical Assistant Professor of Nutrition. She leads the small but mighty Clinical Nutrition Service which has grown to include two ACVIM (Nutrition) Residents and two Registered Veterinary Technicians (RVTs) since 2021.



### Caitlin Grant

BSc, DVM, DVSc candidate (Department of Clinical Studies), ECVCN resident

Dr. Caitlin Grant attended the Ontario Veterinary College (OVC) and graduated with honours in 2014. After graduation, Dr. Grant became an associate veterinarian in a private, mixed animal practice. In 2017, she returned to OVC and completed a nutrition residency through the European College of Veterinary and Comparative Nutrition (ECVCN) and earned a Doctor of Veterinary Science (DVSc) degree in September 2020. Dr. Grant then joined OVC as Assistant Professor and held the Nestlé Purina Professorship in Companion Animal Nutrition. She was service chief for the OVC-HSC Clinical Nutrition Service and taught nutrition to students in all four phases of the DVM program. Dr. Grant joined the Animal Hospital of Cambridge Team in May and will be starting a brand new Nutrition Service where she will be offering in-person and remote nutrition consultations with pet owners as well as providing support to veterinary teams.



### Erico Ribeiro

MV, MSc, PhD, DVSc candidate (Department of Clinical Studies), ECVCN resident

Dr. Erico Ribeiro obtained his veterinary degree (MV) at Federal University of Pelotas (UFPe) in Brazil in 2010, where he also completed a residency in small animal medicine in 2012. He then completed a residency, a master's, and a PhD in nutrition and clinical nutrition of dogs and cats at Sao Paulo State University (UNESP) with Dr. Aulus Carciofi. He joined the OVC Clinical Nutrition Team in 2020 as a DVSc student and a resident of the European College of Veterinary and Comparative Nutrition. His research focuses on feline fatty acid metabolism.



### Younes Chorfi

DVM, PhD

Dr. Chorfi obtained his veterinary degree in 1994 at the Agronomic and Veterinary Institute of Rabat, Morocco. He then completed a master's degree in Veterinary Pathology and Microbiology in 1999 and a doctorate in Veterinary Biomedicine in 2005 at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Montreal, where he is a Full Professor of Nutrition, Food and Animal Production. Dr. Chorfi is the current Director of the Department of Veterinary Biomedicine at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Montreal. He has authored numerous publications and his research interests include biomarkers of exposure to mycotoxins in pets, the effect of mycotoxins on the health and performance of domestic animals, the immune system and susceptibility to infections, and improvement of animal health through nutrition and targeted feeding.
