She has authored articles and textbook chapters on various subjects in small animal dermatology. She is particularly interested in resistant staphylococci and how they are changing practice. Dr. Gortel is a long-standing member and past president of the Canadian Academy of Veterinary Dermatology. She has also served on the Examination Committee of the American College of Veterinary Dermatology.
