O.M.R. Session

Dr. Fred Gingrich II (American Association of Bovine Practitioners) will talk about recruitment and retention in bovine practice.

Brenna Grant (Canfax) will bring us a cattle market update.

Matt Makens (Makens Weather, LLC) will talk about long-range weather forecasting and how weather impacts the cattle industry.

WCABP's 2024 annual general meeting will be held over lunch.

Meg Harrington (Nashville Animal Hospital) will share information about enhancing large animal practice efficiency by using credentialed veterinary technicians.

Meg Harrington, along with Dr. Phil Buote, Dr. Ben Schultz, Dr. Betty-Jo Bradley, and Dr. Chase Wendorff, will take part in a round table session to discuss using techs in cattle practice.
